**HOYNE RAIDS JONES' PLACE IN  
MURDER PROBE**

State's Attorney Hoyne last night raided Roy Jones' dive at 21st street and Wabash avenue and brought to his office about twenty men and women in an effort to unravel the mystery concerning the killing of Isaac Henagaw by "Duffy the Goat."

Waiters, entertainers and regular hangers-on of the gay redlight cafe were brought to the Criminal Courts building and questioned by Ass't State's Att'y Michael F. Sullivan and Edward Fleming, secretary to Maclay Hoyne.

It was nearly midnight when the last witness was examined. Then Fleming gave the following statement to the reporters:

"Marcell Pardon, Robert Crawford and Al Brown have admitted the murder was committed inside the cafe. They were induced to tell a falsehood at first through the fear that Roy Jones would lose his license. When they were given to understand that they would be indicted as 'accessories to the murder' unless they told the truth they came through willingly."

Roy Jones said he had just come into the dive when the shooting occurred. The license, which is in the name of Ray Campbell, may be revoked.

Att'y Charles E. Erbstein did not surrender "Duffy the Goat" yesterday, but admitted he talked with him over the telephone. He may be surrendered today.

**PROBING ALLEGED FRAUD IN  
CHICKEN SELLING**

New York, April 11.—United States District Attorney Marshall is today probing charges that certain poultry dealers stuff the crops of chickens with gravel before bringing them to market. By this scheme it is declared New Yorkers pay for over 200,000 pounds of sand and rock each week when they buy freshly killed chickens.
