MILLIONAIRE INDICTED AS RESULT OF WHITE SLAVE CASE

*Chas. W. Capper, of Capper & Capper, Indicted After
Conviction of John A. Maloney, Big Milwaukee
Politician—Revel at Hotel Sher-
man Is Told Of.*

Indicted for swearing to false statements and trying to block the United States government in a white slave case, Charles W. Capper, owner and founder of Capper & Capper, exclusive haberdashers, faces a term in federal prison and a heavy fine if found guilty.

The indictment was returned by a federal grand jury in Milwaukee yesterday and the evidence in Capper's case all centers in the Hotel Sherman, Chicago.

The story of Capper's indictment and the conviction of the man he was trying to protect has been shut out from Chicago daily newspapers though the case has real news in it because it is the first case in which the United States government has ever convicted accessories along with a principal for violation of the Mann act.
