Elizabeth Gurley Flynn speaks tonight in Hod Carriers' Hall, Harrison and Green sts., on "Small Families—A Proletarian Necessity."

The case of Margaret Sanger will be discussed in part by Mrs. Flynn. Mrs. Sanger, formerly a trained nurse, edited the Woman Rebel in New York. Her paper was suppressed by postal officials because of a series of articles titled "What Every Girl Should Know."

Mrs. Flynn is an I. W. W. organizer. She believes working girls about to be married and the wives of workingmen should have the right to know how to control births. She has a 4-year-old boy of her own and says she can give the viewpoint of a mother to her speech.
