LABOR BODY TO FIGHT HARD TO FREE LAWSON

Washington, July 15. — American Federation of Labor will do all it can to free John L. Lawson, labor leader under sentence to life imprisonment in connection with Colorado mine war, Secretary Frank Morrison of the organization declared today.

Mass meetings are already being throughout the country, editorials are being published by newspapers whose sympathy the federation commands and contributions are being received to carry on the fight.

PROMISED THRILLS PRODUCED AT SENSATIONAL TRIAL

Bedford, Ia., July 15.—The promise thrills were produced yesterday at the trial of the men accused of the 1868 murder of Nathaniel Smith, cattie man, and his son, for a \$90,000 pot of gold, which was buried and regarding which whispers have never died down during half a century.

Samuel Anderson, whose demand for a fourth of the estate started the investigation by the government, said he moved to the Klondike farm, where the gold was hidden and which was then known as the Collins place, in 1888. He said that Bates Huntsman and his brother, Dr. Huntsman, tried to scare the family away with ghost stories.

"Finally they gave it up," he said, "and told me there was a treasure buried on the farm. They promised me a dollar in every four if I found it. There was \$90,000. They said, they got for some city property they sold and they told me the man who buried it, their partner, was dead.

"The day I finally found the box Bates and the doctor were there. They said I better not look in it. While we were arguing the doctor's son came out of the woods with a gun. That was Charley Huntsman, who lives in Fresno, Cal., now. He had been watching me. They said they'd have Nate Damewood count the money and give me my share, but I never got it."

Mrs. Maria Collins Porter was the strongest witness for the state. Despite the fact that Bates Huntsman is now almost an octogenarian she declared she recognized beneath the lines of age the Bates Huntsman of her girlhood.

"Yes, that's him," she cried. "Bates Huntsman, that's you with your whiskers and your trembling hands and them eyes. I'd know them anywhere after the way they looked at me that night. You was with Johnathan Dark, one of them carryin' the blanket with the body in it."
