Petrograd.—Russian arms withstood 3 furious attacks by Field Marshal von Mackensen's German troops near Hrubiesof and swept forward recapturing 3 villages from Germans.

Germans continued to attack practically throughout territory from

Wieprz to the Bug.

Rome.—Venice Gazzettino reports thrilling battle between Austrian aeroplane and Italian troops at Verna in course of which aeroplane came near destroyling famous tomb of Juliet, known to world through Shakespeare's play, "Romeo and Juliet." One incendiary bomb dropped so close to tomb that the ground nearby was torn up.

Aeroplane which flew the tri-color of France despite fact that it was an Austrian flying machine, dropped 5 incendiary bombs. One fell within the barracks at Campoflore, causing

slight damage.
