## IS OLD ROCKEFELLER BIGGER'N UNCLE SAM?

*Can Big Biz Representatives on Industrial Relations Commission Smooth Down the Ugly Facts About Colorade in Report of Industrial Relations Commission?—Story of a Private Car.*

There's a row on in the U. S. industrial relations commission and the big issue appears to be whether Uncle Sam or John D. Rockefeller is the bigger.

If the members decide that John D. is bigger than Uncle Sam then the report of the commission won't recommend that congress compel John D. and his son and his Mackenzie King to answer certain questions they refused to answer before the commission.
