

## DIG UP FAKE DOCTOR'S CELLAR AFTER GIRL'S STORY

A charred bone found in the water heater, a pan of red stuff that may be blood and the finding of a girl unconscious on an operating table in the home of Peter J. Krakowski, 2339 W. 21st st., has gotten the police to digging in the cellar of the home.

Beatrice Byron, 15, 919 W. 35th, was found on the operating table. She says she went to tell Krakowski that her mother, Mrs. Bessie Paporaitis, wanted to see him. Her mother is at a hospital, it is said, because of an illegal operation.

Miss Byron says Krakowski gave her a pill tried to hypnotize her and then lulled her into unconsciousness with a hypodermic injection. When she came to he was working over her with instruments, she told the police.

Krakowski is a watchmaker, but dabbles in medicine. Five years ago he was arrested in connection with the death of a child and last year he was fined \$100 for practicing medicine without a license.

Krakowski, his wife, son Julian and son-in-law, John Siembliki, 2149 S. California, are under arrest.
