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CENSUS BUREAU HOLDS BACK FIGURES

No Statistics On Number of Mothers Employed—
Mortality Among Infants In Steel Towns Greater
Than In Residential Center—No Basic
Reasons Presented

Washington, Dec. 27. — Because the officials of the census bureau have decided against the publication of the most important statistics collected in the 1910 census nobody in the United States knows how many fathers or how many mothers there are in the country; nobody knows how many mothers are forced to go out into the industrial struggle to help support their families; nobody

knows how much unemployment there is in the United States; and nobody knows how many capitalists and owners of industry there are compared with wageworkers.

And because the census officials, strangely enough, selected the statistics of most interest to the workers as those which it would NOT publish (because it did not have funds enough to publish all statistics collected) the children's bureau finds it
