LESSON NO. 6.

(Danced to Victor Herbert's Famous "Pan-Americana.")

Take open position. Three walking steps to the right, and "point," then three walking steps to the left, and "point." Then a walking turn in four counts and end in attitude, shown in photograph; hold four counts.
