### U. S. BUSINESS MEN READY TO QUIT GERMANY QUICK

The Hague, April 22.—Many Amer-  
ican business men in Germany have  
made preparations to wind up their  
affairs and leave within 48 hours' no-  
tice if diplomatic relations between  
Germany and U. S. are broken off.

There are now about 700 Ameri-  
cans in Germany. Since Lusitania  
crisis last May all have been in close  
touch with their consulates at sug-  
gestion of Consul General Lay at  
Berlin.
