#### PRES. WILSON LEADS CAPITAL PREPAREDNESS PARADE

Washington, June 14.—With Pres. Wilson at its head, marching on foot, Washington combination preparedness and Flag day parade started from peace monument today at 9:40.

The president wore a blue serge coat, cream trousers and white shoes. The sartorial display was topped with a natty straw hat. Over his shoulder he carried an American flag.

All government departments and business houses in the city that could be closed without entirely stopping the business of the nation and the city locked their doors to permit their employes to march. The schools were closed and thousands of children were in line.

It was the first time in the nation's history that a president had marched here in such a demonstration.

The program was for the president

to leave the procession at the White House and review the remainder of the paraders as it swung by into the broad thoroughfare between the White House grounds and the state, war and navy department buildings into the velvet green expanse surrounding the 555-foot monument to the first president, who said:

"In time of peace prepare for war."

#### WHY IS ARREST ORDINANCE DITCHED ASKS RODRIGUEZ

Today Ald. Rodriguez will again write Chief Healy and ask in a nice way why another ordinance passed by the city council and introduced by himself was not being enforced by the police department.

This ordinance gives the police department power to use the summons system in the arrest of persons who have positions or live in Chicago. It provides that a citizen locked up on a city code offense shall not be detained longer than is necessary for the police department to check up and find whether or not he told the truth about his job or his address. Then they are released on their own recognizance, after being told what court to be in and when to appear there. It is the same system as is now being used in Ireland with success.

One of the especially good features about this ordinance is the fact that it will save labor unions thousands of dollars yearly from illegal arrests by the police department; that is, arrests which the municipal courts usually later decide were not justified. It will prevent men and women who haven't a "fiver" for bondsmen, to go home or back on the picket line.

Chief Healy refused to obey the fender ordinance, refused to give the council information several times when he was asked, and is now threatened with a demand to appear before the judiciary to tell why Chicago is "wide open," as certain civic and reform organizations say it is.
