

POLITICS AND CLOSING LAW VIOLATIONS BLAMED FOR HEALEY'S SHAKE-UP

Chief Healey this morning issued another order for a police shake-up. Violation of the Sunday closing law and politics are held back of the order. Captains transferred are: Barney Baer from Maxwell to S. Englewood; Jos. C. Mullin from S. Englewood to Maxwell; Henry E. Gorman from Brighton Park to Shakespeare, and Thos. F. Meagher from Shakespeare to Brighton Park.

Lieutenants transferred are: S. C. Rank from Englewood to Stockyards; Patrick Hogan from Warren av. to W. Chicago; Thos. C. Monahan from Stockyards to Englewood; Wm. Fitzgerald from Lake to Desplaines; E. J. Grady from Desplaines to Lake; E. McCann from Stanton av. to Stockyards and John Martin from traffic dept to Fillmore.

Twelve new lieutenants were appointed, several detective sergeants were transferred and the threat is made that all officers reported incapable will be brought before the civil service commission.

PLAGUE DEATHS IN N. Y. FALL OFF IN PAST 24 HOURS

New York, July 13.—162 new cases and 17 deaths was infantile paralysis record in New York city for the 24 hours ending at 10 a. m. yesterday. This represented a falling off from the day before of 33 in victims reported and 15 in deaths. Total victims now number 1,440 and deaths 287.

In a study of over 1,000 cases in the present outbreak, Dr. George I. Nicholas, chief of the health dept's bureau of epidemiology, places the adults who have contracted the disease at less than one per cent.

The number of persons over 15 who appeared in the group was 10.

Ninety per cent of those in the group were under 5.

There have been few victims under 1 year of age.

Dr. Nicholas' study does not include the cases of the last two or three days, the complete records of which are not yet available.

QUESTION REPORTED FIGHT OF TREVINO AND BANDITS

El Paso, Tex., July 13.—Information received here that Carranza Gen. Trevino furnished Villa with munitions cast doubt today on Trevino's reports of attacks by his men on the bandits operating in the Parral district.

Telegraphic communication was cut by Villistas north of Chihuahua during the night. The "break" is believed to be in the vicinity of Santa Rosalia and north of the point where the main body of Villistas is operating.

Carranza agents have furnished United States officials here with detailed charges of a plot by Trevino to assist the rebel movement in Northern Mexico with the ultimate purpose of replacing Villa at its head.

This, coupled with the attack on American troops at Carrizal by Trevino's orders, nearly precipitating war, is said to have caused War Minister Obregon's order replacing Trevino with Gov. Gen. Ignacio Enrique.

80 SUBS BEING BUILT ON THE ORDER OF DEUTSCHLAND

Copenhagen, July 13.—German newspapers assert that 89 submarines of the Deutschland class are now being built and that 20 will be completed in August.
