## MAN SHOTS WOMAN; TAKES OWN LIFE—HEAT BLAMED

Mrs. Jos. Hoar, 950 Marquette rd., was packing a lunch to take to her husband at the Pennsylvania railroad shows when a neighbor rushed in, shot her three times and then killed himself while she watched him from her bed of blood on the floor.

The neighbor was Chas. Rabe, 948 Marquette rd., a conductor on the Ashland car line. Police believe he was driven mad by the heat.

Mrs. Hoar has a fighting chance to recover, but the bullet Rabe put in his own head killed him instantly.

"There was no trouble between Rabe and us," said Mrs. Hoar. "I don't know why he did it."

## POLICE BELIEVE THEY HAVE SLAYER OF BROR JOHNSON

The police believe they have captured the slayer of Policeman Bror Johnson, who was shot down when he interrupted the robbing of the Cook Tourist Agency, Jackson blvd., near State st., months ago.

John Glowacki, alias Frank Hayes, alias "The Rabbit," was arrested last night by Policeman John Slupkowski, who has been looking for him for 14 years.

Fourteen years ago a saloonkeeper was murdered, and Slupkowski believed "The Rabbit" did the job. He has never ceased to look for him, and last night came his chance.

A man talked too much in a saloon near Noble and Ingraham sts., near the scene of the murder 14 years ago. Someone telephoned Slupkowski that the talkative one was "The Rabbit."

"The Rabbit" put up a stiff fight against arrest.

"This is a tip-off," he complained. "No copper on earth could get me without a tip-off."

At the North av. station he refused to give his name. It was found that his hair was dyed brown.

Police believed Glowacki was in partnership with John Rudnick, gunman who was killed by Policeman Coley Madden, May 9.

The police seem confident that either Rundick or Glowacki slayed Policeman Johnson. They are looking for "Goldie," the blond woman who was with the slayer of Johnson when the policeman was shot down. "Goldie," they say, was a friend of both Rundick and Glowacki.
