**LAWYERS AND POLICEMEN  
CALLED IN BIDDINGER CASE**

A number of prominent members of the Chicago police force, attorneys and private detectives were called before U. S. Comm'r Mason in the federal building Monday to tell what they know about Guy Biddinger, New York manager for the Burns Detective Agency. They are Chief of Police Healey, ex-Chiefs Jas. Gleason and John McWeeney, Chief of Detectives Jas Larkin; his subordinate, Charles Larkin; ex-Chiefs of Detectives J. J. Halpin, and P. D. O'Brien, ex-lieut. of detectives; John Tobin, Att'y Alfred Austrian, Private Detective Walter O'Brien, City Detectives Michael Wagner and Jas. Bailey; James Murphy, reporter for the Chicago Journal, and Charles Fitzmorris, sec'y to Mayor Thompson.

Evidence against Biddinger will be taken here and sent to New York, where extradition proceedings are pending against the detective.

Biddinger was indicted here in a police graft scandal and has been named in several others which occurred while he was a city detective. He is fighting extradition from New York.

**BISHOP DUNNE INJURED, ONE  
PRIEST KILLED, IN AUTO WRECK**

Peoria, Ill., Oct. 4.—In the worst automobile accident to happen here in many months Rev. Father Schuetz, chancellor of the Peoria diocese, was killed outright and Bishop Dunne of the Peoria diocese and Father Shannon, vicar general, were seriously injured. The automobile turned over, pinning Father Schuetz under the wreckage. Bishop Dunne sustained internal injuries and Father Shannon sustained a broken leg. The party was on its way to Princeville to conduct confirmation services.

**RUMANIAN ARMY ATTACKED  
FROM THREE SIDES**

London.—Rumanian army that crossed Danube into Bulgaria is under attack from three sides.

Salonika.—Advancing from Karadzakoi, British troops yesterday stormed and occupied part of village of Jeniko, south of Seres road.

Berlin, via Wireless to Sayville.—From Sept. 20 to Sept. 29 German submarines operating in North sea and English channel sank in addition to those previously reported 11 English fishing steamers and 4 Belgian sea lighters and 35 other hostile boats, including 27 fish steamers, with total tonnage of 14,600. Thirty-one prisoners were brought in.

Sofia.—Bulgarian forces have occupied Rumanian island of Kalaklafat in the Danube, near Vidin.

Berlin.—The Rumanian force that crossed Danube and invaded Bulgaria forced to withdraw. Attacked on three sides by German and Bulgarian troops and threatened with envelopment, Rumanians retreated.

Petrograd.—Russian gunboats have steamed down Danube river and are bombarding Bulgarian left flank near Basovs in Dobrudja.
