

second formation. On the first play the left tackle comes around on the signal, takes the ball from the quarter and bucks through tackle. The backs, 2, 3, and 4, move from their positions to the right side of the line, as shown in diagram 2. As soon as the tackle is downed he lines up over the ball as a center and without a new signal passes the ball back to No. 1, who shoots it as indicated to No. 4.

If worked properly this play will take the opposing team entirely by surprise. The play should be started before they have a chance to line up for defense.

Battling Levinsky upset all dope in Boston last night when he decisively whipped Jack Dillon and took the title of light heavyweight champion. The Hoosier was good for five rounds and did some execution with a vigorous right, but thereafter it was all the New Yorker. ### PANIC FOLLOWS EXPLOSION IN NEW YORK SUBWAY

New York, Oct. 25.—An explosion in the subway at Lenox av. and 116th st. early today missed crowded train by two minutes, injured two women, rattled and broke windows at some distance and blocked traffic.

The explosion created a panic. Men and women scantily dressed rushed out to learn cause while fire engines responded to frightened calls.
