

WASHINGTON IN WARTIME—WHITE HOUSE IS NOW GUARDED AS NEVER BEFORE



Extra precautions being taken to guard President Wilson include the construction of an iron gate at the entrance to the white house grounds nearest the executive offices. There never was a gate there before.

This picture, rushed especially by Staff Photographer Robert Paine Dorman, who is now in Washington

snapping pictures daily for The Day Book, shows the new gate and two guards, with the white house in the background, the flag flying o'er it.

The smaller picture shows a sentry box at a corner of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. There is one at each corner to protect this building from spies and secret agents who might try to bomb it or get possession of government secrets.
