PROCLAMATION TO COUNTRY ON WAR DECLARATION

Washington, April 6. — President Wilson this afternoon issued a proclamation to the people of the country declaring a state of war exists between the United States and the Imperial German government.

At the same time he especially directed all officers of the United States government, civil or military, to exercise vigilance in the discharge of their duties incident to such a state of war.

He also appealed to all American citizens to uphold the laws of the land and "give undivided and willing support to those measures which may be adopted by the constitutional authorities in prosecuting the war to a successful issue and in obtaining a secure and just peace."

St. Paul. — Former Sec'y of War Stimson in address to enthusiastic mass meeting urged that America strike a man's blow and fight the war with men, not with money and "moral support" alone.
