Kiev.—War prisoners employed on municipal work here on strike for 8-hour day.

Petrograd. — 1,000 war-maimed soldiers march streets in protest against peace talk.

Detroit.—All recruiting records in Detroit broken over Sunday, when 564 men, facing draft, enlisted.

Paris.—21 of crew of two French fishing boats shot to death after they had taken refuge in riggings from U-boat fire on their ships, according to Nantes dispatch.

Washington. — National American Woman Suffrage ass'n asks 500 chambers of commerce to do their part in getting man's pay for woman doing man's work in war time.
