VETERAN INDIAN FIGHTER DEAD.

William Creer, Soldier, Citizen, Legislator and Successful Business Man, Succumbs to Dropsy and Heart Disease—Funeral Sunday.

Spanish Fork, Aug. 10.—The community sustained a severe loss today in the death of Hon. William Creer, who for forty years past has spent his active and almost unbounded energy in the performance of a work that has greatly benefited this section of our State. His demise was not unexpected. For sixteen months he had been a sufferer from dropsy and heart disease and for the greater portion of that period his family and friends had been prepared for the inevitable. But as Mr. Creer himself, he was hopeful to the very last, and was confident that he would enjoy good health once again.

Mr. Creer was a native of England and was sixty-four years of age. He came to Utah in 1854 and soon after went to Spanish Fork, where he continued to reside up to the time of his death. Many times had he been called upon to represent the people of his own town in various positions of trust and honor. Twice had he been mayor, prosecuting attorney for many years, as well as a member of the Legislature for two terms and a member of the Constitutional Convention, which framed the organic law of the State of Utah. He was also the president of the Spanish Fork Co-op for twelve years. He was a thoroughly successful business man and enjoyed the respect of all classes of the community. In politics he was a Democrat, but was never offensively partisan. He was ever earnest, courageous and faithful man. He participated in the Blackhawk war and performed a number of distinct acts of heroism before the trouble with the Indians had been settled. His funeral will be held in the Spanish Fork tabernacle on Sunday at 2 p. m., at which time a large number of his friends are expected to be present to do honor to his name and memory. He leaves a wife, six sons and one daughter.
