"SMALLPOX" SITUATION.

Disregard of Quarantine Regulations Alarms Citizens.

"Smallpox" in Family of Joseph Checketts—Wedding of Misses Mary Lloyd and Izora Weineheller.

Tuesday a case of "smallpox" developed in the home of Joseph Checketts, on Monroe avenue, one of the children being the victim, but the father was around the business part of the city all day, the police were notified of Checketts' running around town and were hunting him up last night, and when found he claimed that he had not been home since the house was quarantined, but it was seen at his home on Monday and a vigorous complaint was made to the police officers about this case and the opinion that the quarantine regulations should be carried out strictly, and no member of an afflicted family permitted to go about town even if that member were not at home just when the quarantine was placed on the house.

DEATH OF THOMAS PALMER.

An Early Utah Pioneer Passes Away at a Ripe Old Age.

Enterprise, Morgan Co., Utah, Nov. 21.—Wednesday, November 21, Bishop's companion Thomas Palmer, of the Enterprise, died at the ripe old age of 80 years, 10 months and 5 days, of general debility. He was born at Windsor, Berkshire, England, January 16, 1820, and joined the Church in 1847. He was married to Elizabeth Palmer, of the Enterprise, on April 29, 1847. He immigrated to Utah in 1856, and settled in Salt Lake City where he resided until 1861 when he moved to Weber valley and took up the homestead where he resided until his death.

LIFE IMPROVEMENT.

Sentenced Imprisoned Upon Jail for Murder of W. S. Harrison.

Brigham City, Boxelder County, Nov. 28.—James Burke, the man convicted of the murder in this case, was today sentenced to imprisonment upon jail for the murder of W. S. Harrison, for a term of one year and six months. Before passing judgment, the judge asked the prisoner if he had anything to say in his own defense. He made no reply, but he then made an unintelligible statement to the effect that he did not have any recollection of the crime. The judge then proceeded to pass judgment, reviewing the case carefully, and in conclusion said, "The safety of society demands that you be placed where you can do neither yourself nor any one else any harm. It is the desire of this court that you be imprisoned for life at hard labor in the State prison, which is the lightest punishment the law permits in this case."

ATTEMPTED SUICIDE.

John Soderstrom, a Michigan Miner, Shoots Himself While Drunk.

Morgan City, Morgan County, Nov. 25.—On the 27th a Swede named John Soderstrom from Saginaw, Michigan, aged about 49 or 50 years, made an attempt to commit suicide by shooting himself twice through the lungs, he had on his person \$180 in cash.
