WATCH FOUR HUNDRED YEARS OLD

Charles Danforth, an employe in the building department of the city hall, received last week from his father, who resides at Copenhagen, Denmark, a watch which is said to be 400 years old. Accompanying the watch were records which prove it to have been in the possession of the family for 200 years. The watch is smaller in circumference than those of the present day, but is nearly three times as thick, and resembles a sphere cut in half. The face is open. The case is silver, on it being carved a representation of Cleopatra sailing down the Nile. The case is considerably worn, but the engraving is still distinct and beautifully done. On the face of the watch are two dials, one within the other. The outer dial tells the hours, minutes and days of the week and month, there being separate hands for each. On the inner dial are represented signs of the sun, moon and stars. As the day wanes the sun becomes darkened, and the moon and stars shine, while the whole inner dial is illuminated. This effect is said to have been produced by the use of a phosphorus substance, which in the sixteenth century was known and used by the Scandinavians for purposes of decoration. The whole face of the watch is artistically designed, and has been preserved almost without a blemish. The works are of hardened gold and are very intricate. The watch only requires winding once a week, but Mr. Danforth says that when it once runs down he will give it a rest. That it can be repaired when out of order is shown by the records which accompanied it. These set forth that 12 years ago it was put in order at Amsterdam, and that thirty-five years ago it was repaired at Copenhagen. It has been cleaned and regulated several times. There is no date on it showing when the watch was made, but it is claimed to be a relic of the sixteenth century.—Chicago American.
