BIENNIAL REPORT

State Engineer Sets Forth Some of Utah's Water Needs.

State Engineer A. F. Doremus has filed his biennial report with the governor. It is an exhaustive document dealing mainly with the irrigation question and suggestions are offered in the line of proposed legislation. The engineer gets after the sheep and lumbermen, whom he regards as preying upon the watersheds, and criticizes the erection of power plants below where water is taken to fill storage reservoirs. In the matter of improving Utah lake, Mr. Doremus says:

Plans for improving Utah lake as a source of water supply have been discussed in different forms for years.

Under existing conditions, Utah lake furnishes in ordinary seasons a partial supply of water to about 100,000 acres, and now under the canal which have their sources in the Jordan river. In seasons of scarcity, the supply is entirely insufficient for this amount of acreage, and it is thought that the loss of water from evaporation is more than is needed to irrigate fully all the land in Salt Lake valley.

The plan now under consideration contemplated a curtailment of this loss by increasing the depth and decreasing the area of the lake. There is no doubt that the irrigation and agriculture purposes would be worth as much to Utah country as the increased water supply would be worth to Salt Lake county, and that both would be greatly benefited through such work.

PRETTY HARD JOLT
