MCLOSKEY NOT HEARD FROM

Southern Pacific Touched Lowest Point—Large Liquidations in That Stock—Prices Sagged Slowly.

New York, April 7.—Declines in Union Pacific, Southern Pacific and Pennsylvania made the opening tone heavy.

Buck Weaver, the veteran ball tosser, has been heard from. A telegram was received from the old warrior yesterday afternoon.

Changes as a rule were very small and dealings were very light. There were running sales of 1,300 shares of Union Pacific at 9 1/2 to 9 3/4, compared with 9 1/2 last night.
