Utah Will Get One Hundred and Forty-six thousand Dollars.

Washington, May 26.—Commissioner Richards of the general land office has prepared a statement giving the exact amount of the fund set apart for the reclamation of arid lands under the irrigation act of 1892.

The total for 1901 was \$3,144,881, and for 1902 \$4,565,516.

The returns on the sale of public lands for the first three-quarters of the present fiscal year indicate that the receipts will be about equal to the two preceding years, so that by July 1 next the irrigation fund in the treasury department will amount to about \$15,000,000.

Accidentally Killed His Friend. Victoria, B. C., May 26.—While shooting at Parkville yesterday, Richard Christmas was accidentally shot and killed by J. J. Walker mistaking him for a panther.

The men, the best of friends, went out to hunt panthers and separated. Walker heard a rustle among the bushes. Immediately upon looking around he saw an object which he took for a panther crouching between the logs.

Without hesitation he raised his rifle and fired. Investigation showed that he had shot Christmas just above the heart.

FATAL GAS EXPLOSION. Four Men Killed and Seven Badly Burned.

Pittsburg, Pa., May 26.—An explosion of gas in the Charter's Coal & Coke company's mine at Federal, Pa., today killed four men, badly burned seven and slightly injured a number of others.

Several more were hurt and are believed to be still in the mine. As the mine is still afloat it is feared they will be burned to death or suffocated by gas.

The dead: James Nelson, William Nelson, Joseph Siler Jonak.

About seventy-five men were at work when the explosion occurred.

DOCTO IS UNDELY SCORED. Very Often in Need of a Bath and Frequently Clothes Should be Burned.

Chicago, May 27.—"The scientific knowledge and the mission of the doctor of medicine should combine to make him the best exemplar in society of physical, intellectual and moral cleanliness.

Yet I see doctors every day who need a bath, whose very clothes should be burned, and if they were to go with the clothes the world would not be moved deeper, nor sorrow long. Often looking of the gross violations of all the laws of sane and healthful living."

Plain statements and caustic truths like this were plentiful in an address by President Andrew Sloan Draper at the commencement exercises of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the University of Illinois last night.

His subject was "The Personal Equation in the Medical Profession."

"In view of all the things which modern scientific knowledge enables one to know with certainty," President Draper said, "there is too much uncertainty, too much blundering in medical practice. To trifle with human life in defiance of well known scientific truths, to proceed upon mere guess when the facts essential and competent and exact treatment may be ascertained, is an offense against decency and should be made an offense against law which would land one in jail."

BREMERTON COUNCILMEN.

Some Are Threatened with Tar and Feathers and Expulsion from Town.

San Francisco, May 27.—A special to the Call from Tacoma, says: The citizens of Bremerton threaten a coat of tar and feathers and the forcible expulsion from the town of several members of the council, who are held responsible for an order issued yesterday by the navy department, practically closing the Puget Sound navy yard.

Mavor Croxton is authority for the statement and his expression of the community's sentiments is endorsed by many prominent citizens.

By yesterday's order the fleet of warships now in California waters is directed not to sail for Bremerton, where extensive repairs to the vessels were to be made. Besides this, work on the gun boat Ranger, now at the navy yard, will be discontinued.
