poly in villages such as are found in Idaho ever escapes detection, and if what has been asserted by your ex-Mormon witness and the very estimable lady from Pennsylvania whom I learn never lodged a night in Idaho, until she was hired to come and tell her story was really true, not now would the cry be raised, but years ago would have been such an outburst of offended virtue as began and ended with effectually stamped out such offences.

DO NOT CONDONE CRIME.

No, senator, the Gentile women in the Mormon counties of Idaho are not different from the great Christian women and you may depend upon them to guard the moral influences surrounding their homes and past their husbands, brothers and fathers if such marriages are being contracted and you can depend on them to see that the practice always has begun and pushed to a successful conclusion.

Polygamy consists of a man living with more than one wife which is bigamy and as our penal code, section 297, defines bigamy, and as section 469 defines a punishment for it by fine not exceeding \$2,000, and by imprisonment in the state prison, not exceeding three years, the safety of the community and the purity of the home seem to be fairly well guarded from that crime, especially as under our constitution no bigamist or polygamist can act as juror. Dear senator, I regret to think that you are simply trying to fool the people.

Polygamy is a crime. All political parties are opposed to crimes, so you need lose no sleep as to the final result. The Republican party on the 8th of November next will elect its state and legislative tickets. If the present laws are not sufficient, they will do as they always have done, enact others. The Republican party, of which you at the time were a member, enacted the test oath and afterwards embodied it in our state constitution, not in the form of an oath, but as a part of the qualifications of an elector. The official oath was stricken from the statutes after Idaho became a state because it had been embodied in the organic act and for the further reason that the women of Idaho were given the franchise, the right to vote and hold office. No distinction in that respect being now made on account of sex, therefore the official oath, which was a part of the territorial statutes, was stricken from our state code for the reason that we could not ask our wives, our sisters, our daughters or those of our neighbors to subscribe to an oath that they were not criminally intimate with men. Had this oath been continued no self-respecting woman would have qualified for an official position, or would have gone to the polls to cast a ballot while liable to be subjected under the law to such an insult. The repealing and modifying of this oath is the only change made in
