A SAD AFFAIR. Nine-Year Old Child Killed While Playing on School Ground.

A very sad and lamentable accident occurred on the school ground at West Jordan several days ago in which Lulu Lancaster, the 9-year-old daughter of Robert Lancaster, was killed while playing with her school mates. The little girl was running near the building when she collided with another girl, running in an opposite direction, and was knocked to the ground, her head striking the corner of the building. Medical attendance was secured as quickly as possible but the child was dead when the doctor arrived. It was found that her skull was fractured just above the right temple, causing death almost instantly.
