Mayor of Chinatown is Arrested After Eight Days in Salt Lake City.

WANTS TO STAY IN AMERICA.

Was Once Deported and Came Back To the United States by the Canadian Route.

Once again the mayor of Chinatown is in trouble, and must stand trial to prove his right to be in the United States.
