
Big Events Soon to Take Place at Daytona Where Records Fall.

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


Won the featherweight championship of the Pacific coast from Eddie Armstrong in Olympic club tournament in four rounds.

Beginning on Decoration day, lovers of horse racing will be given a royal treat of their favorite sport. In addition to the regular dates assigned to this city by the newly organized western circuit, Mr. W. S. Jones, the man who has done much for the sport in these parts, will give four days racing, and will give the most liberal purses ever offered in the State of Utah.

The dates for these events, aside from the circuit events, will be Decoration day, July 4, July 24 and Labor day. For each day Mr. Jones will hang up purses aggregating \$1,500. On the first day \$800 will be given in the free-for-all, \$400 for the 2:20 trot and pace, and \$300 for each of the running races.

NORMAN DOLE GETS POLE VAULT RECORD

Decision Recently Announced by Secretary Sullivan of Amateur A. U.

A VERY INTERESTING FIGHT.

Was Made for World's Record, But it Was a Long Time Before Winner Received Due Recognition.


A decision just announced by Secy. James E. Sullivan of the Amateur Athletic union, brings to a close a long controversy as to the world's pole vault record, and gives a tardy recognition to Norman Dole of Stanford university, who did the trick with his pole last April for 12 feet 1.32 inches.

This history of the fight for the recognition of this record has been an interesting one, in which prejudice against the west, and especially against the extreme west, where "Native Son" enthusiasm was supposed to predominate over the securing of accuracy measurements, has played a large figure.

True, there have been many discouraging reports, but for all that the outlook is bright, and those interested in the fascinating national pastime, are working like beavers for the success of the sport.


Whether the old league will be continued with two clubs added, or whether a new league will be organized, remains to be seen.
