TROUBLE GROWS WORSE AT YALTA

Rioters Have Destroyed All the Warehouses and the Police Station.

SHOPS HAVE BEEN SET ON FIRE.

Troops Guard Postoffice and Treasury Building—Reinforcements Are Expected.

EXCITEMENT AT SEBASTOPOL.

Passengers Bound for Yalta Are Stopping There—Soldiers Are Being Forwarded.

Yalta, Crimea, March 27.—The situation here is becoming worse. Rioters have destroyed nearly all the warehouses and vodka shops and the police station and a number of shops have been set on fire. Troops are guarding the postoffice and treasury building. The arrival of reinforcements of soldiers is expected momentarily.

EXCITEMENT AT SEBASTOPOL.

Sebastopol, Crimea, March 27.—The news of the disorders at Yalta greatly excite the local population. According to the latest advices, the chief of police of Yalta has been seriously wounded. Warships and three companies of soldiers are being sent there. Passengers bound for Yalta are remaining here.

WHY VON NOLKEN LIVES.

Warsaw, Russian Poland, March 27, 1:55 p. m.—Boris von Nolken, who was injured by the explosion of a bomb yesterday, owes his life to the bad aim of his assailant, who threw the bomb behind instead of underneath the cap. The body of von Nolken is full of innumerable splinters of the bomb. The assailant has not yet been found. The man who previously threw a bomb into the police station at Praga, a suburb of Warsaw, injuring six policemen, is believed to be dying. He was injured by a fragment of the bomb which struck him in the head. He refuses to reveal his identity, but declares himself to be a Socialist. The greatest excitement prevails throughout this city. The man who threw the bomb into the police station in the Praga suburb was later identified as a locksmith named Stephen Okrajka, 18 years old and a resident of Nowominsk district.

A ROUGH VOYAGE.

Steamer Pretoria Experienced Very Rough Weather.

New York, March 27.—Three days behind her record time for her passage the Hamburg-American line steamer Pretoria came in today from Hamburg with a story of extremely severe weather on the Atlantic. Constant westerly gales and head seas varied only by periods marked by an increase in the adverse conditions was in brief the Pretoria's experience as related by her officers. One life was lost that of a seaman who was blown into the sea during a hurricane. The Pretoria's passenger list was increased by three during the voyage. All the hitherto were in the stateroom quarters. Among them were Charles Rogers, Lieut. Vargas, of the Russian army. He is going to San Francisco to look after Russian transport affairs there.

FRANK ELY ROGERS.

Boy Who Returned Suddenly Maintains Silence.

Chicago, March 27.—Frank Ely Rogers, who returned suddenly to Evanston yesterday, nearly four years after the mysterious disappearance of himself and his aunt, Miss Florence Ely, from the home of Charles Rogers, the lady's uncle, maintained silence today at his whereabouts and doing since leaving his uncle's Evanston home in July, 1901. The boy is said by his father, James C. Rogers, to have denied being with Miss Ely and to have denied seeing her since leaving home. Frank has learned nothing more from the boy, Mr. Rogers today. "He has been in Pittsburgh and I think in other eastern cities. I am not going to bother him with questions and when he gets ready to tell me all he wants to say I shall listen."

MOOR ATTACKS ENGLISHMAN.

At Tangier, His Watch Ring Parrying the Blow

Tangier, Morocco, March 27.—Walter B. Harris, the correspondent of a London newspaper, was attacked by a native while in the British postoffice today. His assailant, a Moorish hotel guide, suddenly rushed upon him with a knife which, however, struck the leg of Mr. Harris's watch and slightly wounded him in the stomach. Mr. Harris says he is not aware of any reason for the attack.

BEEF TRUST INQUIRY.

Grand Jury to Have Two Additional Adversers.

Chicago, March 27.—Investigation of the "beef trust" was resumed by the grand jury. The grand jury will have for additional advisers from now on, Asst. Dist. Atty. Godman of Omaha and Asst. Dist. Atty. Godman of Chicago. It is said the inquiry is likely to last for two months longer. It is declared that when the government has finished its investigation into the packing industry it intends to take up railroad and private car lines.

AGAINST CIVIC FEDERATION

All New York Unions Called Upon to Withdraw from It.

New York, March 27.—At a meeting of the Central Federation, union resolutions were adopted calling upon every union to withdraw from the Civic Federation. It was further resolved to call a mass meeting and agitate against giving private corporations any more franchises for sub- scription of these resolutions followed the reception of reports from a commit-

tee sent by the central federation to confer with the president of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters regarding re-employment of men who lost their jobs as the result of the recent strike. This report showed that Mr. Belmont declined to make any concessions, saying that the road was equipped with all the men needed, and that the former employees could be re-employed when vacancies occurred. Recognition of any union was also refused. When the delegates heard the report pandemonium reigned. Delegates arose and shouted at the top of their lungs against Mr. Belmont. Attack after attack was made against the Civic Federation, which demanded that every labor leader should resign from that body. Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, was also denounced. The resolutions were then adopted.

SENIOR AZIROZ FUNERAL.

Names of Honorary Pall Bearers Are Announced.

Washington, March 26.—The honorary pallbearers at the funeral on Tuesday of the late Senator Don Manuel de Aziroz, Mexican ambassador, were announced today, as follows: Secy. of the Treasury Shaw, Actg. Secy. of State Ades, Count Cassini, Russian ambassador, Baron Edmondo Mayor Des Planches, Italian ambassador, Mr. A. Grip, minister from Sweden, and Corbin, minister from Costa Rica; also Justice Fuller of the United States supreme court; Senators Shelby M. Cullom, Representative R. H. Pitt, and John W. Foster. Senior Jimbo, the charge d'affaires, and expressed the appreciation of the Mexican government for the regrets of the United States. He personally replied to President Roosevelt's message of sympathy.

"THE DAWN," NEWSPAPER.

Prince Ukotsky's Paper Uncertain Remarkable Report.

St. Petersburg, March 27, 12:40 a. m.—Prince Ukotsky's new paper, Dawn, has unearthed a remarkable report made by Gen. Kurapatnik to Emperor Nicholas in the fall of 1903, in which the war minister expressed the opinion that the Yaliu concession was sure to induce war between Russia and Japan. The optimistic view of Russia's ability to cope with Japan on land and sea, but expressed apprehensions that the Yaliu concession would take advantage of the struggle to threaten Russia on the west while Great Britain brought matters to a climax with the Afghans. The whole tenor of the memorandum indicates that danger of the Euro-Asian war was not far off. MAXIM GORKY.

Doctors Say He Must Go South If He Is to Recover.

St. Petersburg, March 27.—Maxim Gorky's health is increasing, according to the doctors. The doctors declare that his transfer from Riga to Russia is absolutely essential to his recovery.

Alexis Still in Russia.

St. Petersburg, March 27.—The report published abroad that Grand Duke Alexis had fled from Russia is untrue. He has not left St. Petersburg. A showing the faith existing in remote sections of Russia that the imperial rescript of December 25, assuring the establishment of a parliament, petitions are already being received addressed to the "National Assembly" and last week the parents of school children at Ekaterinoslav south Russia, met and adopted formal resolutions for submission to the parliament asking for the enactment of the "National Assembly" and a share in the administration of the schools and the free admission of children without regard to rank or religion, etc.

FRENCH DISPATCH BAGS.

Two Official Ones Mysteriously Disappear.

Paris, March 27.—The authorities here are seriously concerned about the mysterious disappearance of two official dispatch bags, containing orders to the French squadron in the Indian ocean. The bags, which were forwarded to the commanding officer of the French squadron, disappeared between Port Said and Jibuti, French Somaliland. The investigations made have not resulted in finding any trace of the missing bags, and some fears are expressed that they may have reached those interested in learning the plans of the Russian second Pacific squadron.

Surveillances Over Russians.

Paris, March 27.—The police are exercising extensive surveillance over Russian refugees in Paris, according to reports that they are organizing to assist the revolutionary movement in Russia. It is claimed that much compromising correspondence has been seized, but the refugees assert that it is principally matter connected with the student agitation. The surveillance follows rumors that Father Gopon is hiding in or about Paris.

THE AMERICAN DANGER.

Privy Counselor Goloberger Says It Does Not Exist for Europe.

Berlin, March 27.—Privy Counselor Goloberger, adviser of the German emperor, is about to publish a pamphlet, "The American Danger," which is a continuation and supplement of his book. He compares the economic forces of the United States and Germany, and also recognizes the resources, technical equipment and capabilities of the United States. He concludes that the American danger does not exist for Europe and especially for Germany. Herr Goloberger contends that the commercial relations of the United States and Germany ought to be readjusted by a reciprocity treaty.

No Peace Negotiations.

Paris, March 27.—The French foreign office renews its assurance that nothing has been undertaken here relative to peace negotiations. The Venezuelan status is unaltered. The officials here taking the view that no action will be taken until the Caracas court decides the question pending the report of the commission of the French cable company.

A REMARKABLE EXPERIENCE.

Richard Crendon Blown Through A Break in a Tunnel Under East River.

CARRIED TO SURFACE OF WATER

Was Shot Twenty Feet Into the Air And Escaped Only Slightly Hurt.

New York, March 27.—Blown through a break in a tunnel under the East river, by an explosion today, carried to the surface and shot 20 feet into the air, Richard Crendon, a laborer, was rescued only slightly hurt. His escape from death seemed almost miraculous. Three of his companions were rescued in the tunnel and carried out, all painfully but not seriously injured. The men were at work in the forward compartments of the railroad tunnel under the East river, between Brooklyn and the Battery, with it to be used eventually to connect the Manhattan lines with Brooklyn subway lines. Two tubes side by side are in process of construction. The Brooklyn end of one of the tubes had been extended about 15 feet behind the end of the pier line at the foot of Jordan street. Twenty-two men were at work in the tunnel today when the accident happened. Crendon and his three companions were in the forward compartment working under high pressure of air. In a compartment back of them 18 other men were at work. This second compartment was not affected by the accident, as there is a bulk-head between them. Crendon was the first to ascertain that the roof of the tunnel was leaking, and that the air was rushing into the bottom of the East river, which was about 40 feet deep above them. With sand bags he attempted to plug up the leak but as he did so the whole roof was blown out and the tremendous force of the compressed air drove Crendon out through the hole. The upward rush of air carried him to the surface in a twinkling and he shot into the air with great force. Bystanders quickly rescued him out of the water. He was considerably bruised and shaken up, but was not dangerously hurt. Bystanders who saw the man shoot to the surface say that he was shot 20 feet into the air from the level of the water and that his startling appearance severely frightened the onlookers. Crendon and his companions were dragged back into the tunnel by workmen from the next compartment.

COMMISSIONERS MET SEPARATELY

Portland and St. Louis Committees Held Sessions in State Executive Offices.

Lexington, Ky., March 27.—Judge James Hargis, his nephew, Albert Hargis, and Ed. Callahan, sheriff of Brentlitt county, were today held without bail on charges of complicity in the feud murder of James Cockrell in Jackson, Ky., three years ago, while Senator Alexander Hargis, arrested in the same connection, was released on \$15,000 bail. The decision was announced today by Judge Park. The case is now on the question of bail. The trial of the case will be held at the present term of court. All of the men arrested in connection with the case are held in Kentucky business and political circles.

German Cruiser Falke.

Guayaquil, Ecuador, March 27.—The German cruiser Falke has anchored off the island of Puna. After coaling she will proceed to Mania, Ecuador, and Panama, and probably to San Francisco. She did not come to Guayaquil owing to fear of yellow fever.

Japanese Release Many Who Fell Into Their Hands.

Washington, March 27.—The Japanese legation has received the following dispatch from Tokio: "Of the Russian non-combatants who fell into our hands at the battle of Mukden, the following were released: In front of our advance guard, 47 men, ranking as officers, 359 men ranking as non-commissioned officers, nine nurses, four priests, four mechanics, 100 men to the army. Released at their desire in Chefoo or Shanghai, 23 men, ranking as officers; 23 nurses, 288 men, ranking as non-commissioned officers."

Starvation Threatens Armenia.

London, March 27.—Starvation threatens Armenia, according to a cable message from Yerevan received today by the Bible Lands of Turkish Mission Aid society from the local agents of the society. The message reads: "Suffering from poverty. General food supply in many villages nearly exhausted. Deaths from hunger beginning."

Work Resumed at Batoum.

St. Petersburg, March 27.—Since the proclamation of a state of siege work has been resumed at Batoum and ships are again loading at the quays.

Boodling in Nebraska.

Lincoln, Neb., March 27.—A committee of the senate which is investigating the charges made by an Omaha newspaper that \$500,000 boodle fund had been raised by county officers in this state to help insure the passage by the legislature of a bill which would enable the present county officers to hold their places two years longer, has asked for power to make arrests. This means, it is said, that an official of Omaha is to be arrested.

Capt. C. F. June Dead.

Newburgh, N. Y., March 27.—Capt. Charles F. June, who in his younger days, was a champion skater and carman, is dead here at the age of 80.

Dr. J. B. Whiting Dead.

Janesville, Wis., March 27.—Dr. J. B. Whiting, surgeon-general of the Grand Army of the Republic, is dead.

THE POPE HOLDS SECRET CONSISTORY

No New Cardinals Were Created but a Number of Bishops Were Preconized.

FRANCE AND THE PAPACY.

Vatican Not Responsible for Trouble That is Bringing About Separation of Church and State.

Rome, March 27.—The pope held a secret consistory this morning without creating any cardinals, merely preconizing bishops. The only American was the Rt. Rev. Thomas F. Hickey, who was confirmed coadjutor bishop of Rochester, N. Y. Monsignor Zolico Raccoti was confirmed as auxiliary bishop of Montreal, Que. All the cardinals met in the hall of the consistory of the Vatican where they received the pontiff. The pontiff then delivered an allocution and immediately afterwards proceeded to the preconization of bishops. The allocation in moderate terms deplored the persecution from which the church suffered in recent events in France where he deplored the diplomatic rupture between the republic and the papacy the statesmen are preparing for the separation of church and state for which, the pontiff asserted again, the Vatican was not responsible as has been alleged.

COMMISSIONERS MET SEPARATELY

Portland and St. Louis Committees Held Sessions in State Executive Offices.

TRIP TO COAST WEDNESDAY.

Governor and Commission Going to Oregon—St. Louis Exhibits Turned Over This Afternoon.

The commissioners from Utah appointed to manage the state exhibit at the coming Portland fair, and those who had in charge the recent St. Louis exposition met separately in the state executive offices, and agreed upon 2:30 o'clock this afternoon as the hour for turning over the exhibits of the St. Louis fair for transportation to Portland. The proposed trip to the coast, which the commissioners have announced, was postponed until Wednesday morning, at the suggestion of Governor Cutler, who found it inconvenient to leave Tuesday evening, as planned. The assembly of the Utah commission for the Louisiana Purchase Exposition was meant to be its final one, unless some unforeseen obstacle intervenes, its adjournment tonight will be sine die, with all of its business completed, and the world's fair deficit a matter of history. When the committee met, Treasurer Willis Johnson had on hand as assets the \$7,500 appropriated by the Legislature for the use of the commission, over the protest of several house members, and the \$233 cash on hand when the Legislature met, which the house sought to recover summarily into the treasury by the passage of one of Harry Joseph's resolutions, which lost its energy in the senate. This money was increased to a total of \$9,872.20 by \$41.20 turned in by Director General Whitaker from the sale of concentrates. The new list of outstanding indebtedness was the notes held by local banks, endorsed by prominent citizens, for a total of \$8,669, without interest. The item of an overdraft at the Commercial National bank, for the amount of \$1,163.30, was also included. Prof. Cummings as director of the educational exhibit, and freight and storage bills ran the total up to \$299 above the funds on hand. It was proposed to meet this shortage by striking out the item of interest from the notes held by the local banks, and taking the balance of \$21.90 still above the funds available, from other claims.

LOVSEY LEFT OUT.

The claim of E. S. Lovsey for a small balance due him for wax was not allowed, as a receipt was presented by the Director General, White, showing that he had received the money. This claim figured to some extent in the house investigation.
