

TROOPS WILL BE SENT TO CUBA

U. S. Forces Probably Will be Landed in the Island as Precautionary Measure.

LENGTH OF INTERVENTION

Very Indefinite—Sufficient Force Will be Maintained to Uphold the Provisional Government.

Washington, Sept. 30.—American troops now are moving toward Cuba. Mobilization of the forces will be at Newport News, Va., for the most part, although a part of the expeditionary force to Cuba will be sent from New York and Tampa, Fla. Advice received at the departments of the military today indicates that all is quiet in Cuba and that the insurgents intend to lay down their arms. The probability is the United States forces in the island will be landed only as a precautionary measure. So far as officials are advised no trouble of a serious kind is anticipated, but in connection with instructions from President Roosevelt hurried preparations are being made for the sending of an expeditionary force of the army of Cuba.

The first American troops will be landed at Havana next Saturday. Meanwhile, the American fleet in Cuban waters will protect American interests and support Secy. Taft, the provisional government of Cuba, the maintenance of order and the protection of life and property.

In official circles here American intervention was regarded as an inevitable long and a foregone conclusion. The nature of the intervention and the propositions for it indicate a supervision of Cuban affairs as part of the American government. Arrangements have been concluded not only for the expeditionary force to Cuba of about 100,000 men, but for a second force of equal numbers. No orders for the mobilization of the second force, of course, have been issued, but if the men are needed all arrangements have been completed for hurrying them to Cuba at the earliest possible moment. Which of the two troops than are included in the expedition will be sent to Cuba will depend upon the developments in the island during the next 40 days. It is certain, however, that sufficient force of American troops will be maintained in Cuba to support the provisional government and to insure security to life and property pending the establishment of a stable government by the Cubans.

Operations in all departments of the military establishment of the government today were on a war basis. The chief secretaries and chiefs of bureau were at their desks and every office was humming with activity. Scores of men who have not worked on Sundays in the Spanish-American war were on duty at the war and navy departments and at the headquarters of the marine corps.

Gen. Almonstorf, military secretary, and Gen. Bell, chief of staff of the army, worked throughout the day, concluding arrangements for the departure of the expeditionary force of Cuba. It is certain, however, that today a large number of orders were sent to officers who are to leave to join their regiments.

Secy. Taft, as the head of the president's special mission of Cuba, has available nearly 5,000 marines and blue-jackets, who could be landed on Cuban soil in a few hours in case of emergency. Other marines are on route to Cuba, and will be available for emergency service in two or three days. It will be a full week before the forces of the army can be landed in Cuba. The first detail of troops will leave New York on Wednesday on board the army transport Sumner. They will arrive at Havana on Friday afternoon next. It probably will be several days later before other troops of the first expeditionary force of the army will be able to reach Cuba. Where they will be landed is yet undetermined. It is likely they will go to Havana, but their precise destination will not be determined until practically the hour of the sailing of the transport.

A NET DECREASE IN THE PENSION ROLL.

Washington, Sept. 30.—The net decrease in the pension roll of the United States for the fiscal year ending June 30 last, amounted to \$12,470, the largest decrease ever known in the history of the country. These facts are brought out in the annual report of Commissioner of Pensions Warner, which has just been completed. The report of the commissioner expresses the opinion that there will be a still more marked decrease during the present year.

During the year there were added to the roll 33,459 new pensioners and 1,465 restorations and renewals, making a total addition of 34,924. The total number of pensioners on the roll during the year was 1,638,415.

The number of pensioners dropped from the roll during the year was 47,444, leaving the number of pensioners June 30, 1906, 988,971.

The maximum of pensioners in the history of the military history of the bureau was reached Jan. 31, 1905, when it was 1,004,196.

The decrease was the principal cause of the decrease of the last year, the number of names dropped on that account being 43,300. Of these 29,208 were those of survivors of the civil war, leaving 666, 455 survivors of the war still on the roll. There are still four pensioners on account of the revolutionary war, one a widow and the other three daughters; 680, all widows, on account of the war with Spain, and only 896, 445, 444 had been paid out prior to the beginning of the civil war. Of the total, \$3,258,306 was on account of the civil war, \$1,472 on account of pensions on account of the Spanish war reaches \$15,438,355 up to date.

SHIPPING MEAT.

After Oct. 1 That for Interstate Commerce Must Bear Stamp.

Washington, Sept. 30.—Beginning Oct. 1, the railroads will refuse to accept meat in interstate commerce which does not bear the proper stamp of inspection from the department of agriculture. Realizing at the last minute that their business may be seriously hindered by the provisions of the new meat inspection law, many small packers have appealed to Secy. Wilson and his assistants within the last few days to inspect their plants and grant them the much-coveted inspection stamps. But a large number of these packers will be disappointed. A rumor gained circulation several days ago that an extension of the time for the full enforcement of the law had been full of Secy. Wilson, but this was erroneous, and all firms which have not obtained inspection stamps must suffer after Monday next.

BP. WILLIAMS SAYS BIBLE NOT THE WORD OF GOD.

Detroit, Mich., Sept. 30.—Bishop Charles B. Williams of the Episcopal diocese of Michigan, in an address to Y. M. C. A. members here today on "The Bible and the Word of God," declared that the Bible was not the word of God, and that the teachings to the contrary are the most prolific source of evil that the church has to contend with.

The bishop said: "Nowhere does the Bible declare itself the word of God. Yet we are told to take it in its entirety. It is a venerable book, and visitors are requested not to touch it. As it is the direct word of God, there is no other. 'Take the young man just out of college. He reads Genesis and finds impossible geology, astronomy and ethnology. His teacher, when questioned, says: 'Manipulate it until it fits your scheme.' If you honest to handle the word of God truthfully, the young man gives up the Bible. He refuses to stuff his reason. 'The Bible needs no defense; all it needs is a square deal. There are those who read it devoutly, diligently. But I never say the Bible is the word of God. To those who accept the entire book as the literal word of God, I would point out that it is nowhere so stated. Christ rose asunder the Old Testament precepts, the law of Moses, and furnished new ones. Where the Old Testament directs the men to hate their enemies, the teachings of Christ were to love your enemies. 'We must learn from the Scriptures itself how to read the Scriptures. RUSSIA'S NEW LAND POLICY

Machinery Set in Motion for Distribution of Land to The Peasantry.

Payments Spread Over Fifty Years—Voluminous Regulations to Guide Agrarian Commissions.

St. Petersburg, Sept. 30.—The final step to set in action the machinery of the government's plan for the distribution of land to the peasantry was taken today by the publication of voluminous regulations to the local agrarian commissions, under which the sale of 11,000,000 desiatines of land in European Russia will begin immediately. These commissions, which are composed of delegates elected by the peasants, the landowners and the zemstvo, and of representatives of the government, acts as intermediaries in the valuation of the land and the fixing of conditions of sale. They are charged with arrangements for emigration also. The acreage in eastern Russia and on the Siberian steppes surrendered by the emperor will be sold on easy terms. The price is less than \$2 an acre, and payments are spread over 50 years. With the Constitutional Democratic congress only one week away and the formation of a formidable new party on Count Heyden's platform, peaceful transfer of park land has been postponed, subject to the restrictions of ex-Premier Witte's temporary law. Encouraged by this concession, the Constitutional Democrats contemplate transferring their congress of Oct. 5 from Helsinki to St. Petersburg, but they will adhere to the arrangements made to meet in the Finnish capital unless they are definitely assured of non-interference, as they are in whole some fear of the regulations of "reformed security." It is expected that 400 delegates will attend the congress. The appeal for mitigation of the death sentence passed upon the assassin of Gen. Kozlov, who was killed in Peterhof park last July, has been joined by the general's widow. After fruitless intercession with the commander of the St. Petersburg garrison, Mme. Kozlov has telegraphed the emperor, asking that no further blood be shed upon the tomb of her husband.

ESTATES PILLAGED.

Viyazniki, Vladimir Province, Russia, Sept. 30.—Agrarian disorders have broken out here, and a number of estates have been pillaged.

GERMAN SOCIAL DEMOCRATS.

Mainheim, Germany, Sept. 30.—The Social Democratic party re-elected Herr Bebel and Singer to be members of the managing committee of the party, and adjourned to meet at Essen in 1907.





