THE HARANGUE OF DUBOIS.

If further proof were needed of the true calibre of the leaders of the anti-Mormon crusade, Senator Dubois furnished it in his insolent attack upon President Roosevelt, which he made part of his plea for the exclusion of Senator Smoot from the place to which the people of Utah have elected him.

When Gov. Gooding of Idaho and the chairman of the Republican state committee were engaged in inciting law-breaking and law-defying Mormons to additional lawlessness, the president of the United States sent his secretary of war to Idaho to plead with the people to stand by Gov. Gooding, in order to maintain law and order in Idaho.

It is not uncommon for latter-day anti-Mormons to rave against the Chief Executive. We have always maintained that they are the enemies of the American form of government, and that their plots and schemes, if successful, will be a menace to American institutions.
