

THE BROWNSVILLE INVESTIGATION

It Begins in Washington by the Senate Committee on Military Affairs.

ATTORNEYS WERE BARRED.

Negro Soldiers Had no Representative Present—Senator Foraker Will Look After Their Interests.

Washington, Feb. 4.—The investigation by the senate committee on military affairs of the Brownsville affair began today.

The witness then told of getting the guns in the dark, after the racks had been opened.

He testified that a gun cannot be cleaned to pass inspection without a regulation rod, and that only four such rods are provided for each company.

Senator Warren developed the fact that trouble had previously occurred between the negro troops and the people in Texas, and that Harris, when he heard the shooting, feared that members of his company might be involved.

COURT-MARTIAL OF MAJ. CHAS. W. PENROSE.

San Antonio, Tex., Feb. 4.—The court martial for the trial of Maj. C. W. Penrose, Twenty-fifth infantry, charged with neglect of duty in connection with the Brownsville incident, opened today at Fort Sam Houston.

G. W. Rendall of Brownsville testified at the afternoon session. He was positive the shooting at Brownsville, Aug. 13, was done by soldiers. A bullet passed through his house.

Maj. Penrose is charged with neglect of duty and violation of the sixty-sixth article of war.

MINERS KILLED IN AN EXPLOSION

Number of Victims Not Definitely Known But Between Twenty-five and Thirty.

RESCUERS ARE DRIVEN BACK.

Accident Occurred in Davis Coal & Coke Co.'s Mine No. 25 at Thomas, West Va.

Elkins, W. Va., Feb. 4.—The third mine explosion in West Virginia within two weeks occurred today at the Davis Coal & Coke company's mine No. 25, at Thomas, near here, and 25 or 30 miners are said to have been killed.

The disaster occurred shortly after 7 o'clock this morning. Late today the first rescuing party entered the mine. The bodies of six foreigners and one American were recovered at a distance of 100 feet from the shaft.

There is no possible hope that the men still in the mine are alive. The number of entombed men is estimated at 30, and it is probable there are more.

SIX MINERS KILLED IN WRECK OF RAILROAD TRAIN.

Des Moines, Feb. 4.—Six miners were killed and 12 or more injured in a wreck of a coal train on the Chicago & Northwestern railroad near the corporate limits of Des Moines, this evening.

GRIEL COMMITS SUICIDE.

San Francisco, Feb. 4.—Hazel Turner, aged 13, living with her mother in the Lobos square refuge camp, committed suicide tonight by swallowing carbolic acid.
