MRS. WALLACE IS DISCHARGED

Long Preliminary Hearing Comes To an End in Judge Diehl's Court.

ACCUSED OF FIRING BOXCAR.

Ownership of Car Not Established and Alleged Confession Was Not Legal, Says Court.

The case of the state vs. Mrs. Gustie Wallace, charged with setting fire to a boxcar at the O. S. L. freight yards on Jan. 25th, has at last been concluded. In Judge Diehl's court this morning the woman was found not guilty and discharged. There is still another case, that against Abraham Wallace, husband of the woman. No definite arrangements have been made for the trial of this case.

Mrs. Wallace was found not guilty for several reasons, the principal ones being that the ownership of the car had not been proved and that the alleged confession said to have been made by Mrs. Wallace, was not legal. In summing up the evidence Judge Diehl stated, in effect, that Sergeant Roberts admitted on cross examination that certain promises were made, and certain inducements were held out to Mrs. Wallace to make the so-called confession. Without going into further details of the case, the court found the woman not guilty and she was discharged.

CROWDED OFF CAR.
