RUMORS OF WAR IN BASEBALL END.

New York, Oct. 30.—Notwithstanding all the rumors of dissolution which have been heard during the last three days, while the representatives of minor baseball league organizations have been in session here, it is believed there will be no upheaval in the ranks of the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues.

President P. T. Powers of the national association called the second day's meeting of this body to order this afternoon and after a four hours session an adjournment was taken until 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.

Twenty-three of the thirty-five leagues in the association were personally represented. J. D. O'Brien of Milwaukee, president of the American association, submitted two resolutions which were adopted at a conference held in Chicago last Sunday.

These resolutions were to the effect that the Pacific Coast, Southern and Western leagues be reduced from Class A to Class B organizations and that the national association and that the national association be adopted to the extent that next year's meeting will be held there.
