

TRUST COMPANIES WILL CO-OPERATE

Directors Will Lend Personal Fortunes to Meet Immediate Necessities.

MORGAN ENGINEERED SCHEME

Gold Engagements Are Large—Cotton Bills Not Fully Available—Grain to Move Soon.

New York, Nov. 4.—The buoyancy of the stock market today reflected the ultimate decision of large bankers to support the two institutions, the Trust Company of America and the Lincoln Trust company, which have been subjected to the most severe runs during the last two weeks. The day was one of doubt and conflicting rumors, and the fact that it passed without adverse development is an evidence that the worst of the situation is probably over. At a late hour this morning an agreement was reached, largely through the influence of Mr. Morgan, by which the trust companies will co-operate in the future for their mutual protection, and the directors will lend the assistance of their personal fortunes to meet immediate necessities.

The assets of two threatened companies were carefully gone over by experts on Saturday and Sunday, and both of them were found to be solvent, with a considerable surplus after paying all claims and providing for the capital stock. Under the circumstances it was thought advisable for the men to support them cordially if they would adhere to thoroughly conservative methods and direction in the future.

Gold engagements since the beginning of the present movement now amount to \$22,000,000, which would more than hedge the loss in surplus reserve last week.

The disturbances which are sweeping over the exchange market and arousing concern in foreign markets were indicated today by the fact of foreign exchange in New York considerably above the point at which gold could profitably be imported. The fact that it is still coming this way indicates the determination of New York bankers to strengthen their position even at a loss. The high rate for bills was caused by the demand for exchange to cover the arrivals of gold.

The cotton bills are not yet fully available because shipments are slow and the bills themselves are subjected to considerable scrutiny before they are taken. The fact that the New York market bid a sufficient premium for gold to absorb \$500,000 sterling from the open market and to withdraw an additional amount of \$480,000 from the Bank of England, made at a special meeting today, before the opening of the New York market, from 3 1/2 to 6 per cent, was not sufficient to check the gold movement. Hence arose much talk in London that the rate would be advanced to 7 per cent at the regular meeting of the board of governors on Thursday.

This will be the highest rate attained for many years, but with \$22,000,000 of gold already on the way to New York or engaged for shipment, even a higher rate at the Bank of England would probably not injure materially American commercial interests.

Reports from Washington indicate that the national institutions throughout the country are sound and the efforts of the controller of the currency to get notes into circulation are meeting with considerable success. The calls for bank circulation are so numerous that the mail can hardly be handled promptly by the clerks in the office of the controller. In some of them the amounts applied for are small, but they are scattered all over the country, and it is believed will aid materially in relieving the local pressure.

The price of United States bonds was firmer today than for some time, showing an increase in several classes of a half of 1 per cent, and indicating that the banks were in the market as purchasers. From Boston came the gratifying news that the ledger reserves of the clearing house banks had lost only \$1,751,571 during the past week and stood considerably above the legal requirement of 25 per cent. CONTROL OF CORPORATIONS.

Gov. Cummins Favors It by the General Government.

Washington, Nov. 4.—After an extended conference with President Roosevelt today, Gov. Cummins of Iowa announced himself in favor of the general control of corporations. The governor indicated that an amendment to the Constitution will be necessary before such control can be exercised. Mr. Cummins said that in response to questions by the president he reviewed the financial situation in his section of the country, but declined to indicate whether his report was optimistic or pessimistic. The governor returned to Iowa today.

Cameron, Tex., Nov. 4.—Following his indictment today as the grand juror on a charge of attempted criminal assault, Alex Johnson, a negro, was taken from the jail here by a mob of 500 men and hanged to a tree in the courthouse yard.

Cleveland, O., Nov. 4.—Richard S. Evans, left halfback of the Wooster, O. university football team, who was injured in a game between Wooster and Western Reserve here on Oct. 5, died today.

VIOLATED INJUNCTION.

Cincinnati, Nov. 4.—A violation of the recent order of the court restraining the officers of the International Pressmen's union from advising or furthering a strike for an eight-hour day, was alleged to the court today by attorneys for the United Typothetae. It is now charged that in a general circular to local organizations the injunction has been violated. Nov. 12 was set for hearing.

RUSSIA ENLARGES HER NAVY.

Odessa, Nov. 4.—The ministry of marine today ordered the construction at their Nikolayev dockyards of 11 large torpedo-boat destroyers. The total cost is to be \$14,000,000, and they are to be completed within three years.

GEN. BELL RESUMES WORK.

Washington, Nov. 4.—Maj.-Gen. J. Franklin Bell, chief of staff of the army, resumed his duties at the war department today, after a month's stay at a health resort. He appears to be in excellent physical condition.

U.S. STEEL CO. MAKES BIG DEAL

Secures Controlling Interest in The Tennessee Coal, Iron and Railway Co.

GOT IT THROUGH J. P. MORGAN.

Got Twenty Million Dollars Worth of Stock at Outlay of Seventeen Millions.

New York, Nov. 4.—The United States Steel corporation has secured a controlling interest in the Tennessee Coal, Iron & Railroad company. The deal was concluded today, and is traceable to the conferences held at the home of J. P. Morgan Saturday and yesterday. It is understood that the price paid is a little above \$5 a share. The holdings of a pool controlling some 70 per cent of the stock of the Tennessee Coal, Iron & Railroad company were transferred in the sale. This sale cannot be said to do much to relieve the present financial stringency as large amounts of the stock of the Tennessee Coal, Iron & Railroad company are now held as collateral for loans by the local bankers. The taking up of these loans will add materially to the cash resources of the financial institutions.

In the absence of an official statement, it is estimated that the steel corporation, acting through J. P. Morgan & Company, has secured about \$20,000,000 of the Tennessee Coal & Iron stock at an outlay of some \$17,000,000. This important deal has had the effect of strengthening the Trust Company of America, which held considerable of the stock of collateral and will alleviate the financial conditions that have tended to retard the return of confidence generally. The Tennessee Coal & Iron company is a manufacturer of open-hearth steel and about two months ago received all the orders from Wall street and a portion of his holdings was taken over, it is said, by the other members of the pool. A short while after Col. Payne, Harry S. Black and George Kosaker retired. The trust company then, it is said, lent its resources to prevent the stock from coming on the market at a time when it would have caused general demoralization. The loan by this company is said to have comprised a substantial portion of the pool's holdings at a price around \$8 a share. At yesterday's conference at Mr. Morgan's house, steps were taken to assist the trust company, which resulted in an agreement for today's sale. Those at this conference with Mr. Morgan included Henry C. Frick, Elbert H. Gary and Secy. Richard Trimble of the United States Steel corporation, and Oakleigh Thorne, who is a director of the Tennessee company, as well as president of the Trust Company of America.

The total outstanding stock of the Tennessee Coal, Iron & Railroad company is \$25,500,000. There is also \$248,200 of preferred stock outstanding. The bonded debt consists of \$14,000,000 mortgage, 5 per cent, due July, 1911.
