W. A. CONANT.

Member of Jackson, Mich., 1852 Convention, Celebrates His Birthday.

Colorado Springs, Colo., Nov. 9.—W. A. Conant of this city, who was a delegate from New York with Horace Greeley to the national convention, held at Jackson, Mich., 1852, which gave birth to the Republican party, is celebrating his ninety-first birthday.

Mr. Conant is still hale and hearty. He has been a staunch Republican all his life, and points with pride to the fact that he was born in Vermont, "the state," he says, "which has never voted a Democratic ticket, state or national."

RESSLER & CO. BANKRUPT.

New York, Nov. 8.—An involuntary petition in bankruptcy was filed today against Ressler & Co., bankers, of 44 Wall street, who made a general assignment on Oct. 20, to William Williams.

The petitioning creditors and their claims are: Cripple Creek Central railroad, \$100,000; J. P. White & Co., \$1,000; the Schweizerische company of Switzerland, \$100,000; Lawrence D. Sexton was appointed receiver of the firm and his bond fixed at \$100,000.

The court especially enjoins H. L. Kessler of Manchester, England, and Kessler & Co. in London, to refrain from disposing of any property in which Kessler & Co. of this city have an equity.

GEN. BOOTH SAILS.

New York, Nov. 9.—Gen. Wm. Booth sailed today on the steamer St. Louis for England. At the pier to bid him farewell were about a hundred of the leading staff officers of the United States, representing all sections of the country.

Gen. Booth stood on the middle deck with his retinue staff, and as the vessel moved out doffed his cap repeatedly in response to the cheers and the waving of Salvation Army and American flags by his followers.

Gen. Booth and his party will proceed to Berlin on Nov. 13, where he will begin a lengthy "campaign" in the German empire.

AN INSURANCE SWINDLER.

Family Gets the Money on Supposed Dead Husband Who Returns.

Warsaw, Mo., Nov. 10.—Charles Kullman, who disappeared on July 5, 1901, and the payment of whose life insurance for \$5,000 was contested by the Modern Woodmen of America and the Macabees, was arrested by the police in Chicago, Nov. 9, by insurance Detective Clouse, and he will return to his home in Benton county, Mo., having waived extradition. Kullman disappeared after starting alone from Hoquiam, Wash., and attorneys for his family made numerous trips to Washington and seemed certain that Kullman was dead.

Kullman has been using the name of Charles Taylor and has worked in the logging camps of the northwest. Two years ago the Kullman family won one of the insurance suits, and this year another cause was decided against the family. Kullman was prominent in Benton county before his disappearance, having been a candidate for county collector, and also publisher of the Warsaw Times. A reward of \$1,000 was offered for his body. He is 35 years old.

WANT SPECIAL SESSION.

Newark N. J., Nov. 10.—Gov. Stokes will be petitioned by the Democratic members of both branches of the legislature, it is said, to call a special session of the legislature, for the purpose of ordering a recount of the entire state vote for governor as recorded last Tuesday. FIRE AT IQUIQUE, CHILI.

Two Thousand Persons Rendered Homeless, Loss a Million.

Iquique, Chili, Nov. 10.—This port has been visited by a fire, the biggest since 1882, which has entailed losses amounting to over \$1,000,000. It broke out yesterday, and seven and a half blocks were burned over before it was under control. The property destroyed was mostly dwellings of the poor, and no less than 2,000 people are homeless today. The fire was about one mile distant from the commercial quarter of the city.

MURDER AND SUICIDE.

Falling to Effect a Reconciliation With Wife, Shoots Her and Himself.

Oakland, Cal., Nov. 10.—Murder and suicide occurred in this city at 4 o'clock this afternoon, when J. C. Ehlers, a street car conductor, sought out his child wife at the residence of her mother, Mrs. Angelo Thomas, and falling to effect a reconciliation, shot her through the heart, and then turned the weapon upon himself, sending a bullet crashing into his brain, causing instant death. A child 10 months old, survives the parents.

Ehlers and his wife had been estranged for several months. Mrs. Ehlers returned to live with her parents. Ehlers called at the Thomas home and implored for his wife. Together they went to a room in the rear of the house, Ehlers locking the door. The next moment the family heard pistol shots. The door was broken open and the bodies found lying by the side of the floor. Mrs. Ehlers was 18 years old and her husband 23.

INTERNATIONAL SPIES.

Five of Ring Leaders of Supposed Association Arrested at Toulon.

Toulon, Nov. 10.—Five of the ring-leaders of what would appear to be a most important association of international spies were arrested today by special detectives. The authorities also seized a mass of papers, and a cursory examination of these documents leads to the belief that the gang for a long time past has been carrying on an extensive traffic in military and naval secrets. The local officials consider the arrests so important that they have communicated with Premier Clemenceau.


