



BEAVER IRRIGATION. Land & Power Company Undertakes Big Irrigation Scheme.

CONTRACTS SIGNED UP TODAY

Plan is to Bring Under Cultivation 78,000 Acres of Land in Beaver Co. —Company Gives \$50,000 Bond.

The officials of the state land board today signed the contract by which the first Carey act irrigation project in the State of Utah has been brought to the point of acceptance by the state for the segregation of lands had been made by the United States. This is the project known as the Beaver county Carey act proposition, backed by the Beaver Irrigation, Land & Power company of this city. The company was incorporated under the laws of the state of Idaho May 1907, and its purpose was to reclaim land situated in Beaver county, Utah, under the provision of the Carey act, by which so many thousands of acres have been reclaimed in Idaho and surrounding states. In carrying out the general plan, the company entered into a contract with Minersville, Nev., & Irrigation Co., by which the right to their reservoir sites, canals, rights of way, etc., were secured May 1907. In addition the company was given by the government 1,920 acres of land for right of way for reservoir and canal purposes Nov. 23, 1907. The government also granted the application for a segregation of lands in Beaver county and 4,226.74 acres were awarded to the company in the segregation, to be reclaimed by means of irrigation. The order for withdrawal of these lands for the company, made Feb. 1908, and was signed for the government by Assistant Secretary of the Interior Frank Pierce, formerly of Salt Lake, and President Roosevelt, and on the part of the State of Utah by Commissioner Henry N. Herp. The land is located west and north Minersville, in Beaver county. In addition to the reservoirs, the company has purchased, at a cost of \$175,000, a tract of land in the vicinity comprising 15,000 acres, and this will also included in the general reclamation scheme.

IRRIGATION FACILITIES.

There are four reservoir sites owned by the company where reservoirs will be constructed, consisting of the Minersville No. 1, Rocky Ford No. 2, and Puffer lake, and the Elmer lake. The water from the four reservoirs when completed will hold sufficient water of a finest quality to irrigate 76,000 acres of land. In addition to the reservoirs, pumping plant will be established by the company, for the better handling of the irrigation scheme. The estimated cost of the construction of the reservoirs and canal systems will be \$1,000,000, and it is the intention of the company to make it the model irrigation system of the west.

NEGOTIATING BOND ISSUE.

Negotiations are now in course of completion with New York parties for a bond issue for \$1,000,000, which will be applied to the construction of the system with which to irrigate the land. The bond is to be opened in blocks, and as rapidly as the work of building canals and reservoirs will permit the entire tract will be brought under irrigation. The contract, which is being signed by the officials of the state, will be signed today, requires that work of construction shall begin not later than six months from the date of signing, and a matter of fact, the company expects to begin work much sooner. In addition to signing the contract, the company will furnish a bond in the amount of \$250,000 for the carrying out of provisions. The soil of the county is very productive, and climatic conditions are very similar to those existing in the Salt Lake valley. The altitude is 560 feet higher, but this is offset by the fact that the land is situated miles further south. The Salt Lake Route runs directly through the tract, and the markets at the Princeton, Nevada mining camps tributary to that section of country. The officers of the company are as follows: Joseph Kimball, president and general manager; J. L. Catron, secretary, and Judge C. W. Bartch, attorney, all of this city. The opening of this tract of land is an important item in the history of the central portion of the state, and the movement has been supported faithfully by the people of the state through the officers of the land board, and the people Minersville and immediate vicinity the project.
