REFUSES GROWN MODESTLY TURNS ASIDE SUGGESTION THAT HE BECOME A PROHIBITION LEADER.

ENTRENCHED IN COMMITTEE As Chairman of That Which Will Consider Liqueur Measure He Announces His Opposition to It.

When the present legislative assembly first organized for work, and Rudolph Kuchler showed himself as chairman of the committee on manufacturers and commerce, and it was announced that liquor legislation would go to this committee for settlement, it was declared that a plan to another such legislation had been formed.

Kuchler's first answer was that he was loyal to his constituents and that in spite of criticism he would go ahead with the measure.

weeks before election. And to three people, one of whom was a Democratic candidate for the legislature. Kuchler declared that himself in company with the other Republican candidates were for temperance legislation, and that they favored the local option proposition then going around. Yesterday, the most recent attempt was taken. It was in direct opposition to the measure now before the legislature which it is thought will pass the lower house, if it can again be brought to the delay tactics of its opponents.

COMMITTEE VISITS HIM. Kuchler was yesterday visited by a delegation of citizens who were named at a mass meeting held in Ogden Wednesday evening. Kuchler had been invited to this mass meeting but he had found that his loyalty to the "interests of the people" compelled him to attend an important committee meeting in Salt Lake. Those who called upon him were, D. O. McKay, C. C. Richards, P. T. Wright, L. L. Clark, Hyrum Heininger, and Ross Gray W. McCroskey. They presented to Senator Kuchler the petition signed by 6,000 citizens of Ogden, asking for prohibitory legislation.

Kuchler, who had excellent opportunity to study the saloon question as a part owner of the Columbia Clear company, then proceeded to expound the philosophy of the temperance reform. He expressed first his great pleasure at the honor bestowed upon him in the fact of the call made upon him. Then he said he was more than pleased to see the people of Weber county call upon him to express their views. After that he went on to express his legislative record. He said: "When I was nominated for state senator from Weber county by acclamation, and elected to that position by a flattering majority, I felt that it was due to the fact that the people of Weber county had confidence in me and in my ability to represent them in the state senate.

"During the campaign I promised some of my close friends that in the event of my election to the senate that I would work and vote for the re-election of Reed Smoot to the United States Senate. I took this action because of the influence brought to bear on me, but because I felt that Senator Smoot should be re-elected.

"I am a free man, and I can do as I please. I am not a slave to any party platform, but privately to close friends, I carried out at my earliest opportunity. As you well know, I not only cast my vote for Reed Smoot, but used all my efforts to make his election unanimous.
