

SAV KELSEY LEFT NAMES OFF LIST Property Owners Make Serious Charges Against Former City Engineer. PROTESTED AGAINST SEWER.

Engineer and City Attorney Conspired To Nullify Petition—Work Stopped And List to be Rechecked.

Charges were made by several property owners last night before the engineering committee that Louis C. Kelsey, formerly city engineer, has left the names of protesters off the list of names of protesters of the sewer extension No. 120 which defeated them. The property owners opposed this sewer extension because they did not care to pay \$2.25 per linear foot for it when similar extensions have been let for half the price.

During the argument a discussion arose as to the duties of the city engineer. City Atty. Harper J. Dinwiddie is of the opinion some time ago that if the property owners' names do not appear on the petition as they do on the county recorder's books that they were to be stricken off the list.

DINWIDDIE REVERSED. Patrick J. Daly, assistant city attorney, was present last night and he reversed Dinwiddie. He declared that because the names were not identical on the petition with the names on the county recorder's books, that the engineer had no right to strike the names off the list.

The list will be checked up again and a report on the matter brought before the council. Meanwhile there will be no work done on the sewer. The city engineer has no right to strike the names off the list.
