"They are ennuil," said Paulhan, as he supervised the morning rodding of his Farman and Blériots by his mechanics today. "I shall have to do something to remove that blasphemous."

"Are you not satisfied with having flown higher than any man ever did?" he was asked.

"Mais, non," he replied, hitting his shoulders up to his ears, and throwing up his hands, palms upward, fingers wiggle, where he has been inspecting the records, more records, better records until, puff! breath goes out and I really find that path to paradise—or to Hades."

PAULHAN'S RECORD STANDS

After a three-day struggle with extensive tables of logarithms, the board of aviation judges have finally arrived at the figures which shall stand as the official record of Paulhan's world-beating high flight.

In the afternoon of Jan. 12, 1909, on the aviation field of Dominguez, near Los Angeles, Cal., Louis Paulhan, in a Farman aeroplane, propelled by a 60-horsepower motor, made an attempt to accomplish the world's record for altitude.
