

TAFT'S PLEA FOR UNIVERSAL PEACE

Can See No Reason Why Matters Of National Honor Should Not Be Referred to Court.

WANTS MORE BATTLESHIPS

At Least Until Panama Canal Is Completed—Then Can Stop And Think.

New York, March 22.—The president of the United States spoke in the cause of world peace tonight before such a brilliant assemblage at the Hotel Astor that he described it as superlative. He was the honored guest at a banquet of the Peace and Arbitration league and the principal speaker.

"I do not want to seem inconsistent in speaking so emphatically here in favor of peace by arbitration, and in using every effort I can bring to bear on Congress to have two more battleships this year. I am hopeful we may continue with that policy until the Panama canal is constructed, so that our naval power shall be distributed by the coast between the two coasts. Then we can stop and think whether we wish to go further.

MOORE BATTLESHIPS WANTED

PERSONNEL OF NEW HOUSE RULES COMMITTEE

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The tentative slate is divided into the following groups, one of each group to be chosen: Indiana or Pennsylvania or Smith of Iowa; Michigan or Stevens of Minnesota; Young of California or Hawley of Oregon or Howell of Utah.

From this slate the six Republican members of the committee of 19 may be selected at the Republican caucus tomorrow night. This list does not include a single insurgent Republican.

Republican leaders take the position that only by a rock-ribbed stalwart Republican membership can the rules committee transact an effective business. They contend the insurgents made a mistake in fixing the membership of the committee at 16 instead of some odd number, and that it is plainly impossible to include any insurgent Republicans.

It was said by the regular Republicans that the inclusion of an insurgent as one of the six would give him as great a power as the speaker has enjoyed, as he would doubtless consult his insurgent colleagues on every move and the regulars would have to agree with him or else leave the committee subject to the vote of five, in case the insurgent chose to vote with the four Democrats.

Most of the insurgents disavow any desire for specific representation.

control of the government, is likely to go down at the hands of its own people under the humiliation of the defeat. These two things are working in a healthful way toward peace.

NATIONAL HONOR. "Personally, I do not see any more reason why matters of national honor should not be referred to a court of arbitration than matters of property or matters of national proprietorship. I know that in going further than most men are willing to go, but I do not see why questions of honor may not be submitted to a tribunal supposed to be composed of men of honor, who understand questions of national honor, to abide by their decision, as well as any other question of difference arising between nations."

Whether it is in God's providence that the long gathering resentment against Europe's trespasses on the eastern nations can be allayed without war unless amends and restitution be first made, is a matter for sober thought.

FAIRBANKS' IDEA. Speaking tonight at the banquet of the American League and Arbitration league, former Vice President Fairbanks said: "Mighty changes have occurred during comparatively recent years. The arena is the order of the day in every avenue of human activity.

It is a singular fact, however, that the least progress has been made where there is need of the most and that is in the determination of differences between nations. "There has been, perhaps, no time in the history of the world, when nations in time of comparative peace were expending money more lavishly to maintain and drill armies and expand navies than now, and if the ratio of increased during the last decade is continued, the magnitude of the burden will become astounding.

president touched upon the violation of rights of aliens in this country, recommending the chief executive and the federal courts to give authority to pass upon such violations committed in the several states.

He did not refer to the Japanese, but he spoke of the inadequacy of having treaty violations passed upon by governors or local district attorneys, and continued: "So I thought in view of the fact we are all agreed about arbitration and peace and the abolishment of war, if we can bring it about, I would suggest one practical means by which you can clothe your executive with the means of avoiding difficulties with foreign countries and avoiding a humiliating position for him and yourselves with reference to your pledged promise."

Two ambassadors, Count von Bernstorff of Germany and Simon De La Barra of Mexico were among the speakers of the evening, as were Charles W. Fairbanks, former vice president; J. H. McCroary, former senator from Kentucky and president of the league; Mayor Gaynor of Greater New York and Henry Clews, a New York banker.

MAYOR GAYNOR'S VIEW. The false attitude of superiority on the part of America and Europe in regard to the nations of the east has led to a misunderstanding that may not be dissipated without war and at the least cannot be removed until the west comes to a true conception of the eastern nations, said Mayor Gaynor of New York tonight at the dinner of the American League and Arbitration league.

"The civilization of the west," said Mayor Gaynor, "seems to be reaching along the lines of Christianity when it is now calling for universal international peace, especially peace between the east and the west. We have to ask ourselves whether this can ever come about until the civilization of the west first recognizes the east as a civilization also. We shall never establish peace with the east by persisting in calling it uncivilized. It has a civilization all its own, a thousand years older than ours."

"From being warlike, the nations of the east generally during these last thousand years became unwarlike and peaceful nations, while the Christian nations of the west have continued warlike and aggressive all the while. The constant aggressions of the west upon the peaceful and unwarlike east, motivated by commercial enterprise, if not commercial greed, have been invariably in the name of Christianity. We have taken possession of their choicest provinces and their best ports. And now, in the progress of time, we call for universal peace."

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"Men who, like myself, have the duty to protect and advance the interests of their own country, are not able to coin in dreaming the dream of universal peace. They would soon awake to the stern reality of the fierce struggle for existence that according to the law of nature results in the survival of the fittest."

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
