

LAW MAKERS ARE UNDER SUCCESSION

Distrust of Popular Representation in Legislative Bodies Means Despotism.

EXECUTIVE GROWS STRONGER

So Declares William A. Hotchkiss, New York State Superintendent of Insurance.

Utica, N. Y., April 12.—"The present distrust of popular representation in legislative bodies means sooner or later a practical despotism, declared William A. Hotchkiss, state superintendent of insurance, in a speech at the annual banquet of the Onondaga County Republican league here today.

"Through what a period we have been passing," said Mr. Hotchkiss. "Until recent years considerations on the side seem to have been smiled at by the cynical; the boasts of some of these in the back room talks led toward several disclosures in the inquiry now closing.

"What an atmosphere was that of the capital city where graft has been a subject for joking and the distributors of it honored in song. Each decade of late has seen the executive grow stronger, the legislature weaker; each decade the people have become more satisfied to trust a man, not merely to execute, but even at times to make the law. The executive just now is stronger than ever before.

"Impressed by the corrupt practice of the law, the plain people are beginning to doubt the reliability of the legislative branch. Stories from Mississippi vie in lurid vigor with those from Pittsburgh; tales of New Jersey of late are shadowed by the daily tales about New York. The present distrust of popular representation in city council, in state legislature, even in federal Congress, means sooner or later a practical despotism, a chiefship, which, while still elective, has in it all of the dangers against which our fathers fought hard.

"God forbid that the foundations of representative government should thus be weakened. "And so, I take it, our governor was looking far into the future when he asked a thorough and unsparring investigation into legislative processes and procedure."

THE DESERT NEWS JOB DEPT. MRS. MAYBRICK'S MOTHER.

Daughter Says Story She Died in Want Is False.

Chicago, April 12.—Mrs. Florence E. Maybrick did not die of the death of her mother, Baroness de Rouges, in Paris, until last night.

"For several months the baroness, who had been living with Mrs. Maybrick at Highland Park, a suburb of Chicago, desired to return to her old home in France. But Mrs. Maybrick detested her with the promise of going to Paris with her in May. A month ago, the baroness left Chicago, and a few days later, deserted her traveling companions without explanation. The next information of her was that she had taken ship from New York.

"The story of her dying in want is false," said Mrs. Maybrick. "I have taken care of her and we have been together ever since I left England. She had been with me here, but had been in poor health and believed that if she returned to France she would get stronger. I persuaded her to wait until April or May, then I could accompany her to Paris, but because of the rigors of the Chicago climate, sent her south with friends a month ago. She conceived the idea that she would be in Paris, and left her friends in the south and took boat at New York without notifying me.

"She had been in Paris about a fortnight and I have received three letters from her—all telling how well she was getting along. The last one I received this morning. I had intended going to her just as soon as my engagements would allow me."
