PUSHING WORK IN MASON VALLEY

Making Preparations for Celebration of Railroad Day in Nevada Copper Camp.

Progress in Mason was discussed by E. G. Kilder of that city who was in Reno yesterday, stopping off on his trip from Salt Lake City, says the Journal.

Plans are being formulated for the big celebration in Mason, starting May 7. A special train will be run from Reno and it is expected that many local people will make the trip.

Considerable will be added to the revenue of Reno by the upbuilding of Mason and the valley, and local business men realize the possibilities and the advantages which will accrue to this city.

The town of Mason is situated on the Walker river and stretches away toward the foothills of the mountains from which great quantities of copper are being mined.

INSPIRATION OFFICERS TELL OF FUTURE WORK

Give Details as to the Plans for Development Work at Mine During Coming Year.

Some interesting data as to the work of the Inspiration property is contained in a recent issue of the Boston News Bureau. The annual report of the company shows that the treasury of the company is in excellent shape.

The general balance sheet of the Inspiration Copper Co., as of Dec. 31, 1909, shows as follows:

The directors of the Inspiration Copper Company present to stockholders a statement of property conditions as of March 18.

The company owns 29 mining claims and fractions of claims, covering in all 545 acres. The property lies six miles west of Globe, Ariz.

The ore bodies are found in the belt of mineralized sandstone which extends from the Inspiration mine on the company's eastern boundary in a westerly direction for a distance of 6,800 feet.

NEW STATION.

A station was cut on the 400-foot level and drifts were run to block out the ore. To date we have 2,870 feet of shaft, drifts and raises in the Joe Bush shaft, of which 1,700 feet are in or average 2 1/2 per cent copper.

CHECK RESULTS.

So far we have been able to check the results on one shaft. It will be the result of a 245 feet, 2 1/2 per cent copper. The samples taken every five feet in the raise assayed 2.27 per cent copper as compared with 2.12 per cent for the corresponding distance in the churn drill hole.
