
DEATH OF GEO. CROCHERON. George W. Crocheron, age 84 years, died of general debility Thursday night at his home, 523 east Sixth South street.

BIG INCREASE IN CITY'S VALUATION Property in Salt Lake Is Assessed At \$58,449,826 This Year.

INCREASE OF OVER \$6,000,000 County Auditor Also Completes His Tables Showing a Grand Total Of \$76,214,580.

The assessed valuation of property in Salt Lake City in 1910 is placed at \$58,449,826, an increase of \$6,211,091 over the valuation of last year.
