GREAT POSSIBILITIES IN THE MASON VALLEY

Now Has Six Miles of Workings and Thousands of Tons of Ore Broken Down.

Although the Mason Valley has been hard to develop, owing to the occurrence of the ore bodies in limestone, developments during the last six months or so have been the most important since operations began.

Of the recent developments the most important has been the encountering of ore on the 470-foot level, at a distance of 335 feet from the main vein below the 400-foot level.

ORE RESERVES.

Recent computations of ore in reserve place this figure at approximately 1,000,000 tons, assaying 3.9 per cent copper.

AT THE SMELTER.
