STANDS FAIR INVESTIGATION.

A few days ago we noticed in these columns an appeal made to the Swedish government by ignorant Augustanist clergymen for the expulsion of our missionaries in that country.

We would like to call the attention of those clergymen to the fact that an interpellation was recently directed to the British government in Parliament on the so-called "Mormon" question, and that it was stated that the government, after inquiry, had found no ground for action.
