

WARDEN PRATT SUBMITS REPORT

Conditions Obtaining for Last Two Years at State Penitentiary Described.

TOTAL NUMBER INMATES 295

During Biennium Not a Prisoner Escaped and There Were Only Two Deaths—Hospital Needed.

Including a statement from the prison clerk detailing the improvements made during the biennium, production of the prison farm, and expenditures in maintaining the institution.

Introductory to the report of the warden is that of the board of corrections which suggests several minor improvements and asks the legislature for an appropriation of \$177,206.25 for maintenance during the next biennium.

The report of Prison Physician H. J. Lund, included, calls the attention of the chief executive to the lack of hospital facilities in the prison and points to this as the one place in which the institution is weak.

Forty of the 235 prisoners are confined for burglary. Forty-eight of the entire number of prisoners, have come from the ranks of common laborers, while the farm has contributed the second largest list, there being 22 farmers confined.


