

THE CITY COUNCIL.

Mr. Durie then withdrew his motion, and the matter was dropped.

The following ordinance were then passed: Fixing the limits of the benefits of street lights provided by the city, and without which property shall be subject to a special tax for lighting the streets.

It was then ordered by the council that the street committee be instructed to build sidewalks on Mill street, from the west end of the newly-grated portion of the street, to connect with the sidewalk west.

Ordered that the chief of police notify the owner of property, where notified, on Mill street, to stop a certain sidewalk.

Ordered that the city clerk advertise for bids for lighting the streets and for doing the city printing for the year 1888.

Ordered that the matter of grading the alley between Main and Jackson streets, between Commercial and Third streets, be referred to the street committee, and the matter of putting a sewer in said alley be referred to the city engineer.

The license of Vitus Schmid, Long & Kelly, and N. P. Wildrick, were referred to the license committee.
