BIG LAND SUIT AT TACOMA.
A City Addition Worth a Million Claimed
by the Original Settler.

TACOMA, Nov. 21.-[Special].-The case of
Anthony F. Carr vs. Smith & Fife,
proprietors of the Smith & Fife addition, a tract
involving \$2,000,000, was opened today in the
United States district court before
Judge Hanford, and will probably be con-
cluded tomorrow evening.

The features of the case are as follows:
Carr having taken up the land, 150 acres,
under the homestead act, but leaving it after
two years, one Sproule was allowed by the
secretary of the interior, the case being
appealed to him, to file upon the same under
the homestead law, and was granted a
patent in 1878. Numerous conveyances
followed, the whole quarter section finally
being platted. A portion of it is now cov-
ered by aqueducts. The counsel for the
plaintiff hold that Carr had been upon the
tract two years before Sproule con-
veyed the right on the ground of abandon-
ment, and that Carr being an honorably
discharged soldier, having served four
years, was legally entitled to a patent at
least one year before Sproule began his
contest.

THE COLFAX LIEBEL SENSATION.
Drummer Kitchen Will Ask for \$40,000
-Serious Developments Expected.

COLFAX, Nov. 21.-[Special].-The Kitchen
liebel suit against the Commoner is not to
be compromised. Sensational develop-
ments are very probable. Kitchen an-
nounced today that he would surely bring
suit for \$40,000 instead of \$20,000, as at first
announced. He is said to have gone to
Walla Walla this afternoon for the pur-
pose of securing the services of Brent &
Allen as attorneys. The aggrieved party
claims to have lost his position as drum-
mer for a Portland house, worth \$5,000 a
year, through the articles in the Commoner.
It is stated positively that Wheel-
er makes no complaint of frauds, the prop-
erty having been sold for \$500 and the deed
paid for the purpose of defrauding the lots
more advantageously. If these reports
are established at the trial as facts, it may
be a serious matter for the Commoner.
