Round 1—Both men sparred very carefully for a minute. Kilrain led his left on the neck, and O'Donnell went to his right. O'Donnell jabbed his left on the chest.

Round 2—O'Donnell led his left on the chest, and Jake sent in his left on the chin. Steve put his left on the wind tightly, and then the same hand visited Kilrain's eye and nose three times.

Round 3—Kilrain led his left for the back of Steve's face, and his arms stopped a right and left hand smash in the face. After a clinch he jabbed again in the face, and both punches on the neck.

Round 4—Kilrain returned with his left on the face. Both countered on the left with their lefts, and then Steve put his left on the stomach. Jake went back in the face with his left on the neck.

Round 5—O'Donnell led his left on the face, and Jake got in his left on the neck, and they clinched. Kilrain stopped a hard one meant for his wind.

Round 6—Kilrain landed his left on the face, and Steve swung his right on the cheek, and swung lightly on the face. Steve put in his left twice on the face, and Kilrain sent in his left on the body.

Round 7—Steve tapped Jake's face lightly with his left, and then failed on three leads. He jabbed his left hand on Steve's chest, and landed once more in the face.

Round 8—Kilrain's nose was bleeding. Both led and landed lefts on the face and body. O'Donnell put his left twice in quick succession on Jake's cheek.

Round 9—Kilrain landed his left on the face, and Steve swung his right on the cheek, and swung lightly on the face. Steve put in his left twice on the face, and Kilrain sent in his left on the body.
